





Muroran-dake Loop Hike













Mt. Muroran (室蘭岳, 911m) is a simple half-day hike about 8km north of central Muroran City on the south coast of Hokkaido. Along the way is the cute little Hakucho Hut - it's free to stay overnight, and the hutkeeper is friendly and helpful. From the top of Mt. Muroran, you'll have great views across Lake Toya to the north, and the Pacific Ocean to the south. On the way down the Western Ridge Track, the industrial town of Muroran will be in sight most of the way..

LOCATION

This half-day hike starts at the Danpara Ski Area, about 8km north of central Muroran City on the south coast of Hokkaido. Mt Muroran essentially sits between the Pacific Ocean and Lake Toya, so the peak offers views across both.

GENERAL NOTES

Mt. Muroran (室蘭岳) is not the official name of this mountain – it's actually Mt. Washibetsu (鷲別岳). It was named Mt.

MAP FOLD & LAYOUT CONCEPT | Welldonegan

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Washibetsu in the Edo period, but goes by Mt. Muroran these days. In the non-snow months, the hike up Mt. Muroran is an easy one. It has amazing bang-for-buck value, due to the views across both Lake Toya and the Pacific Ocean. This particular route guide does the full loop from the hut (Hakucho Hutte) up the Summer Trail, then traverses west along to the Western Ridge Trail for the descent. Arguably this is the preferred direction (anti-clockwise around the loop), as the descent down the Western Ridge offers sustained and unobstructed views of Muroran City and Oshima Peninsula the entire way down.

ROUTE NOTES

The route is signposted (in Japanese) at all major junctions. From the ski area carpark to the hut is 15 minutes. From the hut to the Mt. Muroran summit is about 1 hour.

TRANSPORT

By car: There is ample parking (130 car carpark) just before the ski area.

Public transport: There are no public transport options for this route.

SAFETY NOTES

Despite a relative lack of snow (compared with Rusutsu only 30km north), in the snow-bound months (mid-November till early May), the mountain is home to very harsh winter weather and is not to be taken lightly. The hutkeeper informed us that Mt. Muroran has the third-most frequent search and rescue callouts of any mountain in Hokkaido. Known as an easy climb, the mountain does tend to attract the unprepared. Distances are short, but that's no excuse not to be prepared.

ONSEN NEARBY

If you're heading back to Sapporo City, then it would be worth dropping into Noboribet-

su Onsen (登別温泉) on the way home for a soak. You'll have to expect to pay around 1,500yen for the onsen here, but they are very impressive - massive complexes with great outdoor pool options. The two I've been to include Noboribetsu Grand Hotel (1,500yen per person) and the Takimoto-kan (2,000yen per person or 1,500yen after 4pm). The Grand Hotel has a gorgeous outdoor bathing area, whereas the Takimoto-kan has the most enormous indoor bathing area I've ever experienced. It also looks out over the Noboribetsu geothermal area. There are also plenty of more reasonable places to have a soak - http://noboribetsu-spa.jp/ pickup/higaeri/ ■

PRINTING INSTRUCTIONS

STEP 1

Load your printer with A4 printer paper (210mm x 297mm). If you've only got Letter size (215.9mm x 279.4 mm), just follow the instructions below. You'll achive an accurate scale, but the map will be clipped a little at the top and bottom.

STEP 2

Open the print window by clicking on File > Print (or hitting Ctrl + P on your keyboard).

STFP 3

Make sure "Actual Size" is selected.

STFP 4

For double-sided printing, select "Print on both sides of paper".

STFP 5

For best results, select the highest quality print option available on your printer (settings will vary).

STEP 6

You won't need this instructions page, so just select the pages that don't include this instruction sheet.

STEP 7

Click "Print".




Figure 1. Ensure "Actual Size", and Pages 1-4 are selected (Windows).
